from the GM



Firstly I would like to thank all our valued Members and Guests who played at Jagorawi Golf & Country Club throughout 2009. The year saw a lot of improvements both on the courses and in the Clubhouse. Namely on the New Course our dedicated Maintenance crew worked hard and fast to complete re-grassing the 2nd nine holes with a quality 419 Bermuda Turf-Grass which will enable us to maintain the course in an even more challenging way, with higher rough and better definition from the Tee due to its rich green colour. During the course of each holes renovation, the Tees have been completely re-constructed with a tuff, hard-wearing Turf-Grass named "Evergreen" which has fast re-growth capabilities to ensure that Tees (especially Par 3's which are always damaged by divots) quickly recover from weekend to weekend. On our pride and joy, the Old Course renovation of Tees which have become badly "crowned" (uneven on the surface) was the main focus. Many Holes now have even surfaced Tees with "Evergreen" as our Turf-Grass choice.

Finally we can now call the Z-Nine a Par 36, as the 7th Hole has now a new set of Tees in play. Positioned further back the hole has a wonderful new challenging look to it. There is new fairway bunker that will challenge even the most seasoned golfer. Throughout 2010 Jagorawi Golf & Country Club will focus on renovating as many Fairways and Tees of the New Course as possible in an endeavor to have a newer looking New Course completely renovated. Along with Tees and Fairways, we are replacing the Collar around many of the Greens, which will stop possible contamination of the main green surface by encroaching native grasses. The Old Course will have more Tees Renovated in 2010 and better drainage undertaken around many of the Greens. To maintain all of our courses in constant championship condition, we shall be purchasing some new items of modern, high-tech machinery.

The unique beauty of the JGCC Clubhouse has been enhanced with modern furnishings for our guests comfort. New Carpet, Dining Chairs and Tables throughout the Batten Restaurant area along with a New Private Room, available for members to entertain there most distinguished visitors at a very friendly rate. This beautiful, air-conditioned room with scenic vistas over the surrounding gardens has new dining chairs and tables with a comfortable seating arrangement for 16 – 20 persons. Along with this there is a large 46" LCD TV with its own Cable Television connection independent from the rest of the Clubhouse and a DVD player available for added convenience. This room has a private bathroom, toilet facilities and has four VIP size lockers.

We have also recently improved the ambience of the existing air-conditioned Private Rooms with new furniture and a modern "face-lift" These 2 Private Rooms can be joined to make one spacious area with seating capacity for 64 persons. Separately seating capacity for 32, these rooms are made available Free of Charge when the maximum seating capacity is achieved, however those smaller groups can also enjoy the cool "chic" setting for a very modest charge. Our Members Tournament schedule in 2010 is an exciting one with lots of wonderful cuisine and entertainment. JGCC plans to welcome in the year of the Tiger with an aggressive attempt to improve on the already lavish events. We will be working closely with new sponsors and promoters to ensure that these events are unmatched anywhere. On the same topic, please ensure that you register well in advance (with payment) to avoid disappointment as always we will be maintaining a strict "first come, first serve" policy towards participants. Any rise in entry fee prices has been carefully considered prior to any actions being taken. Therefore it is completely necessary to adjust the competition fee in 2010 to ensure that our plans to entertain members and guests to the maximum are realized.

The performance of Caddies has always been paramount on our agenda and 2010 is no exception. We admit that the issue of Caddie Evaluation Cards failed to meet our expectations as many (most all) of the cards became lost by one means or another. Now we are putting the power of evaluating caddies back in the hands of the Player. This is done from the moment you check in! There is an additional slip headed "Caddie Evaluation" issued when you pay your Caddie Fee or Green Fee with Guests.

Simply fill in the space on that slip where it says "Bag Tag Number" with your bag tag number, which was issued by the bag drop staff on your arrival. After the game simply place the slip with the bag tag number clearly stated on it, in the slot which best evaluates your Caddies performance at the "Caddie Evaluation" box found near the locker rooms and the upstairs restaurant. We will do the rest, as your Bag Tag number identifies your Caddie in our system.

It is important that we maintain this Caddie Evaluation system as it is our only sure way of identifying which Caddies need to be re trained and in which areas. Also those outstanding Caddies we reward once a year as a way of showing our appreciation for their diligent service and good attitude towards JGCC Members. As we progressively improve our IT system, at some time in the not too distant future the Bag Tag number will be automatically printed onto the slip, however in the mean time we are asking your assistance by writing it yourselves.

Also in 2010 we will not only be replacing our Golf Cart Fleet with the Newest Model "Precedent" golf cart by Club Car but also adding another 20 carts to bring the fleet up to an impressive 120 units. These carts are designed to maximize player comfort. I am sure many of you will be using these beautiful carts so please remember that the maximum persons on any cart at any time is 4 (including Caddies) along with 2 sets of golf clubs, so please assist us in maintaining the prime condition of the fleet by not overloading the carts and remember to stay on the cart path at all times.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish all Members and Guests very happy festive and holiday season, safe travels and see you all back at Jagorawi Golf & Country Club in 2010. On behalf of Management and Staff, Thank you for allowing us to be at your service.

ANNOUNCEMENT

Improving our service to all of our Members and distinguished Guests is a very high priority on our agenda. In 2009 we introduced "CADDIE EVALUATION" as a means of monitoring the performance of our Caddies. Due to various short-comings the system for Caddie Evaluation by placing numbered cards inside the Caddie Evaluation Box fell by the way-side.

This failure was in fact an important indication to us that we needed to implement a system for evaluating caddies that was entirely in the hands of our Members and Guests. We

are happy to announce that as of December 1st 2009, every player who registers at the JGCC reception counter will receive, along with the standard Player Chit, Starter Chit and Caddie Chit an additional "Caddie Evaluation Chit"

This Yellow slip of paper has a section titled "Bag Tag Number" which each player is to fill in with their bag tag number on that day as received on arrival at the Bag Drop area.

When you complete your round please insert the Yellow Slip of Paper completed with your Bag Tag Number into one of the 2

Caddie Evaluation Boxes located in the Lobby Area and also the Batten Restaurant area.

From your bag tag number we will be able to identify your caddie and assess their performance. Those caddies who consistently show a poor performance will be re-trained whilst those caddies who show consistent good performance will be rewarded. This system we believe will eventually provide better service in essential areas. Please assist us by following the above Caddie Evaluation system after each round. Thank you for your kind assistance.

Club Captains Corner

There have been many changes made to the Rules of Golf that I am sure some of you may not even be aware of. Here are a few of those "Principal Changes" that often occur when playing at Jagorawi Golf & Country Club.

Principal Changes Introduced in the 2008 Code

General: The changes to the Rules generally fall into two broad categories:

(1) those that improve the clarity of the Rules and (2) those that reduce the penalties in certain circumstances to ensure that they are proportionate.

DEFINITIONS

Advice: Amended to allow the exchange of information on distance, as it is not considered to be "advice".

Lost Ball: Amended to clarify substituted ball issues and to include the concept of "stroke-and-distance"

Matches: Definition withdrawn and replaced by two new Definitions, "Forms of Match Play" and "Forms of Stroke Play".

RULES

Rule 1-2. Exerting Influence on Ball: Note added to clarify what constitutes a serious breach of Rule 1-2.

Rule 4-1. Form and Make of Clubs Amended to reduce the penalty for carrying, but not using, a nonconforming club or a club in breach of Rule 4-2, from disqualification to the same as carrying more than 14 clubs.

Rule 12-1. Searching for Ball; Seeing Ball Amended to include searching for a ball in an obstruction.

Rule 12-2. Identifying Ball Amended to allow a player to lift his ball for identification in a hazard (see corresponding change to Rule 15-3, removing the exemption from penalty for playing a wrong ball in a hazard).

Rule 13-4. Ball in Hazard; Prohibited Actions

Exception 1 amended for clarification; Exception 2 amended to refer to Rule 13-2 and to eliminate the reference to assistance in the player's subsequent play of the hole; Exception 3 added to exempt a player from penalty under Rule 13-4a (testing the condition of the hazard) in certain circumstances.

Rule 14-3. Artificial Devices, Unusual Equipment and Unusual Use of Equipment Amended to refer to the unusual use of equipment (see also new Exception on use of equipment in a traditionally accepted manner) and new Exception added for players with a legitimate medical reason to use an artificial device or unusual equipment. Note added to clarify that a Local Rule may be introduced allowing the use of distance measuring devices; previously authorised by Decision only.

Rule 15-2. Substituted Ball Exception added to avoid a "double penalty" when player incorrectly substitutes ball and plays from the wrong place (see corresponding change to Rule 20-7c).

Rule 15-3. Wrong Ball Amended to remove the exemption from penalty for playing a wrong ball in a hazard (see corresponding change to Rule 12-2, allowing a player to lift a ball for identification in a hazard).

Rule 16-1e. Standing Astride or on Line of Putt Exception added to apply no penalty if act was inadvertent or to avoid standing on another player's line of putt; previously authorised by Decision only.

Rule 18. Ball at Rest Moved Penalty statement amended to

avoid a "double penalty" when a player lifts his ball without authority and incorrectly substitutes ball (see related changes to Rules 15-2 and 20-7c).

Rule 18-1. Ball at Rest Moved; By Outside Agency Note added to clarify procedure when ball might have been moved by an outside agency.

Rule 19-2. Ball in Motion Deflected or Stopped By Player, Partner, Caddie or Equipment Amended to reduce the penalty in both match play and stroke play to one stroke.

Rule 20-3a. Placing and Replacing; By Whom and Where Amended to reduce the penalty for having the wrong person place or replace a ball to one stroke.

Rule 20-7c. Playing from Wrong Place; Stroke Play Note added to avoid a "double penalty" when player plays from the wrong place and incorrectly substitutes all (see corresponding change to Rule 15-2).

Rule 24-1. Movable Obstruction Amended to allow a flagstick, whether attended, removed or held up, to be moved when a ball is in motion.

Rule 24-3. Ball in Obstruction Not Found;

Rule 25-1c. Ball in Abnormal Ground Condition Not Found;

Rule 26. Water Hazards (Including Lateral Water Hazards);

Rule 27-1. Stroke and Distance; Ball Out of Bounds; Ball Not Found Within Five Minutes In the above Rules, the term "reasonable evidence" has been

replaced by "known or virtually certain" when determining whether a ball that has not been found may be treated as in an obstruction (Rule 24-3), an abnormal ground condition (Rule 25-1) or a water hazard (Rule 26-1). See corresponding changes to Definition of Lost Ball and Rule 18-1.

Appendix I

Seams of Cut Rurf
New specimen Local Rule added.

Temporary Immovable Obstructions
Clause II of the specimen Local Rule amended to include an additional requirement that, for intervention relief to be granted, the temporary immovable obstruction must be on the player's line of play.

Appendix II

Adjustability
Amended to allow forms of adjustability other than weight adjustment, subject to evaluation by the R&A.

Clubhead; Plain in Shape
Amended to clarify meaning of "plain in shape" and list some of the features that are not permitted; previously detailed in guidelines on equipment Rules.

Clubhead; Dimensions, Volume and Moment of Inertia
Sections added on moment of inertia and putter head dimensions; previously detailed in guidelines on equipment Rules and test protocols.

Clubhead; Spring Effect and Dynamic Properties
New section added on spring effect. The limit, as detailed in the Pendulum Test Protocol, now applies to all clubs (except putters) and in all forms of the game; previously covered by condition of competition.

Fifty-five High School students from International Schools in Bangkok, Singapore, Kuala Lumpur, Taipei, Manila, and Jakarta competed in the 5th annual International Association of Southeast Asian Schools Golf Invitational at Jagorawi Golf and Country club November 13 and 14. The quality of golf was outstanding with the average score from the winning girls' team of 76 for each of the girls 2 rounds while the winning boys team averaged a score of 78 off the blue markers for the two days of golf.

The International School of

Bangkok won the team Gold Medal for girls with one of their girls shooting an outstanding score of 69 on the combined Z-nine, front nine of new course layout for best individual Gross. Miguel Tabeuna of Manila shot even par 72,72=144 to win the individual Gold Medal for boys but the team from Jakarta International School was by far the superior in the contest, taking out the next 6 places to win the team gold medal by a whopping 130 strokes. Five of the six boys on the record setting team are Jagorawi members so special congratulations to the JIS team of Mori Utomo,

Praditya Wirjawan, Gian Wirjawan, Danny Masrin, Satya Djojogugito, and Him Chan (Harris) Yang.

All the players and coaches agreed that this years tournament was the best ever and want to

send a special thank you to the Management and members of Jagorawi Golf and Country club for their hospitality and help in making this a special event.
