



ANNOUNCEMENT

Dear Members,

Recent changes have been made to COURSE MARKINGS

As of Monday, December 10, 2007 several holes of the Old & New Courses previously marked with RED STAKES (Lateral Water Hazard) were returned to WHITE STAKES (Out of Bounds) *apply Rule 27-1*

Also several holes of the Old & New Courses previously marked with RED STAKES (Lateral Water Hazard) where there is no water body present, had the Red Stakes Removed.

If a ball lands in an area not staked, the ball may be found and played from where it lies.

If the ball is found and declared unplayable *apply Rule 28*

If a ball is lost in the same un-staked area *apply Rule 27-1*

To avoid slow play, **when in doubt play a PROVISIONAL BALL** *under Rule 27-2*

During the same re-marking process several CONCRETE DITCHES were retained as part of an adjacent Water Body and staked with RED STAKES OR PAINTED RED LINES. A ball that is inside or comes to rest on such a concrete ditch is inside the lateral water hazard and may be played as it lies or relief may be sought *under Rule 26-1c*

CONCRETE DITCHES that are not part of an adjacent water body had all red markings removed are integral (fundamental) parts of the courses.

A ball that comes to lie in or on an unmarked concrete ditch must be PLAYED AS IT LIES *apply Rule 13* or declared unplayable *apply Rule 28*

All CONCRETE DITCHES are deemed Integral (fundamental) parts of the courses and therefore a ball coming to rest in or on a concrete ditch must be played as it lies; **there is no relief when a ball comes to rest in or near a concrete ditch, even if the concrete ditch interferes with a player's stance or intended swing.**

On the Old & New Course there are several CONCRETE DITCHES THAT ARE ADJACENT TO CART PATHS and MAINTENANCE ROADS. Such concrete ditches are designated as part of the cart path and are an Immovable Obstruction *apply Rule 24-2*
